#### **SYNERGY**

Synergy or Synergism is "the potential ability of individual organisations or groups to be more successful or more productive as the result of a merger".





#### What is "success" Positive outcomes for children, families and communities.

What influences success or effectiveness?

- The quality of the organisations involved
- The quality of the program content
- The subject matter e.g. fatherhood in relation to community.
  A highly emotive and traditional motivation



What is Hey, Dad! For Indigenous Dads, Uncles and Pops (HDI)? Hey, Dad! is a strength based parenting program specifically for fathers and looks at their relationships with their kids or those in their care. HDI acknowledges the place the wider family unit plays in Indigenous communities specifically in relation to being a dad.







## What's In it?



Five sections. Being a Dad Today Understanding Our Kids Yarning Keeping Our Kids Safe Coaching Our Kids

Each section has a wide range of activities and topics that can be adapted depending on the group and it's needs, strengths and abilities

HDI is not a 'test'. It celebrates fatherhood and promotes healthy and strong relationships for our kids.

By acknowledging the past we can get on with the present and the future....they are linked

"The past is not the past. The past, the present and the future are as they always are, part of each other bound together".

"We cannot change the past, which cannot be undone, but we may be able by the generosity of imagination and kindness to change the future for the better, to act in a more enlightened and more humane manner, with greater dignity and true compassion".





Words we don't use..... inability, disadvantaged, deficit, restrictions, authority, fix, wrong etc.

What we do use.... HDI is a 'strength based program' in that we look at what men are already doing and build on that. Men are natural parents, sometimes just the acknowledgement of that can lead to wider work being done.





## Centacare Broken Bay's (CBB) Model

Four basic tenets.....

**Consultation** 

Train the Trainer

**Capacity Building & Mentoring** 

....and...Partnerships....

While each of these are valuable on their own, put them together and we have another example of 'synergy'



## Outcomes

Funds were allocated to evaluate not only The development of the program but also the FaHCSIA funded rollout of HDI training in 2009.

It gave CBB an idea on what the ideal conditions would be for the uptake of actual HDI programs in a community once training has been completed.





"Rather than repeat the train the trainer model, it is suggested that an asset building approach is more likely to be effective in embedding the use of Hey Dad within Indigenous communities".

## The most effective implementation of HDI will occur when a community possesses the following assets...

- strong local cultural connections and credibility
- access to Indigenous men through existing groups or at the least, strong local links
- strong leadership and leaders in a community
- some confidence or ability to lead groups, but not necessarily formal training or qualifications
- access to practical resources such as food, transport and photocopying.



#### We have not come across a community that does not possess some or all of these qualities to some degree.

# Other recommendations from the evaluations.

- the encouragement of agencies to take a 'lead agency' role

- the continuance of prior consultation
- the encouragement of reinvigorating local networks utilising local strengths and abilities.





## **Corrective Services**

All indications point to HDI being even more effective in culturally based detention or residential situations.
