










Theme 1 We all have the right to be safe

Feelings = pictures and symbols, Y charts, songs, books, body messages and body language, Colours and emotions, Dealing with feelings

What is safe =Safety rules, Persona dolls, Popstick people, Animal being safe, Responses, Emergencies / Accidents, Emergency actions, Practice invacuation & evacuation strategies, STOP & NO, Relaxation strategies, Imaging, Soft toys,

Early warning signs= Understanding signals, body signals, Early warning signs, Traffic lights, Stories, Using my voice to get meanings across.

Theme 3 Recognising & Reporting Abuse

Anatomical names for parts of the body = Naming the parts of the body, Meaning of private, Our whole body is private, Asking questions, open talking, Health and safety rules.

Touching = Safe touching, Relationship circles, Dance, Closeness and uncomfortableness, Personal space, Babies and touching, Necessary but uncomfortable touching, Unsafe touching, Puppet and persona dolls, rough and tumble play and when it is not safe. NO and STOP

Define abuse using scenarios = Developing a concept of accidental and deliberate injury, People I don't know who might help, What is abuse, my needs and wants and what is neglect. Clarifying what is Physical, or sexual, or emotional, domestic abuse.

Secrets & surprises = Good secrets/ bad secrets, Surprises, Keeping secrets, Anti 'don't tell strategies, use/ misuse of power. Threats in friendships.


