

Future Parents Program – Pilot Program

2003 - National consolidation of Save the Children Australia.



- 2004 Australian programs team in each state work towards consolidation
- 2006 Program Coordinators in each state completed Cert IV in Facilitating Abuse Prevention Programs
- 2007 Pilot programs rolled out in each state
- 2007 Continued training for more facilitators from each state and continue roll out of programs in each state



SA – Future Parents Program

•Save the Children SA in partnership with Good Beginnings Australia and Kids and U Family Services delivered the first program in May 2007 with the 2nd program in October 2007 called: Looking After Little Ones... and Grown Ups Too!

•10 young mothers took part in this pilot program at the Elizabeth Grove Early Childhood Development Centre and graduated with their certificate.

Programs – WA – East Kimberley

•Communities for Children – working with local organisations in Kununurra, Wyndham & Warmun. Providing activities for 0-5 year olds and their families – playgroups, family events and supporting early learning centres

•Wyndham & Kununurra Youth Development Program – informal mentoring and training programs to disengaged young Indigenous people – providing training, work placement, lifeskills and recreational activities to reengage with the community and promote positive futures



Programs – WA – East Kimberley

Deadly Blokes & Kids

•Only program in the region which focuses on building strong relations between male caregivers and their children.

•Local singer-songwriters to provide weekly music workshops for blokes and kids

•One group has written and produced a CD and performed!
