Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander early childhood and family support services across Australia are community development engines that nurture and protect children, and support families to raise their children strong, healthy and proud of who they are. Despite their crucial role and proven track record, many of these services are grossly underfunded, requiring them to restrict numbers, programs, staff and infrastructure, and are facing an uncertain future, with Federal Government funding uncertain beyond June 2014.

As the national peak body for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander early child and family support services, SNAICC is supporting these services by calling for a 10-year Federally funded plan for integrated child and family services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and families.

What we did

SNAICC sent postcards out to all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander early childhood centres across Australia, and invited them to write a message to the Prime Minister telling him about their service.

Dear Prime Minister

I think it is vital to have Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander services in our area. I have utilised this service for all three of my children and it has provided an excellent

foundation and readiness for their schooling.

They have thrived at school and this service

definitely contributed to their success.

What happened?

In the first few months we received 1200 postcards — and more keep coming. People contributed from all walks of life: families, educators, teachers, health workers, community members and children. They sent powerful messages on the impact and benefits of these services to children, families and communities.
