What is Family Matters?

Family Matters is a national annual report that highlights progress towards reducing overrepresentation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children in out-of-home care. Produced by SNAICC in collaboration with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander leaders and communities since 2016, the report makes recommendations to ensure Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children grow up strong and connected to their culture and holds governments accountable for action.

What is the National Family Matters Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Leadership Group?

The National Family Matters Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Leadership Group provides expert advice and guidance on the publication and promotion of the Family Matters Report. The group is made up of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander leaders from across Australia and is co-chaired by SNAICC CEO Catherine Liddle and Associate Professor Paul Gray.

We are looking for passionate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander leaders, including young and emerging leaders, with expertise in child safety, wellbeing and development.
